



## The Use and Impact of Sports Premium at Chigwell Row Infant School 2017/18

### **Background:**

The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools in the UK.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils progress and participation in PE and school sport. We are required to publish on-line information about how we have used the additional funding. This will ensure that parents/carers and others are made fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at Chigwell Row.

### **How will we be spending the Sports Premium funding:**

We believe that by providing a range of different sporting activities, all pupils will benefit from and find achievement in their PE experience at Chigwell Row. We think that it is important that we give children the opportunity to compete in inter-school competitions and tournaments as this provides them with wider opportunities and perspective.

The Sports Premium funding is spent in the following ways at Chigwell Row Infant School:

- Children in reception and Key stage 1 have access to a six-week course of swimming lessons which take place in the pool of a local secondary school and are delivered by a fully qualified swimming teacher.
- Children in Key Stage 1 have access to a six-week course of dance lessons taught by a fully qualified dance teacher.
- Children in Key Stage 1 have access to a six week course of gymnastic lessons taught by a fully qualified gymnastics teacher.
- Year 2 are transported to another school for their gymnastics lessons so that they have access to a suitable space and suitable equipment for the activity.
- In Year 1, children experience a six-week course of riding lessons taught by fully qualified instructors at a local riding school.
- We use some of the funding to pay for membership of the West Essex Sport Partnership, which gives access to specialist teachers and opportunities for inter-school competition.
- Over the course of the school year, all children have access to hockey, football, tennis, cricket and basketball skills.
- Some of the Sport Premium is used to pay for the hours for the driver of the minibus that transports children to and from events and venues.
- We purchase equipment to offer access to new sports and physical activities as relevant, and update worn or outdated equipment.

### **Impact:**

We evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation and provision mapping arrangements. Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways:

- we look at how pupils' skills improve during the course of the year.
- we monitor pupils' access to quality coaching in a variety of sports.
- we assess the growth in pupils' confidence in physical activity.
- we take feedback from pupils during the year to help us assess the impact on confidence and achievement.
